Information and Fees – Fall 2009 Session

What is the Palatine 50 Plus Computer Learning Center?

We are a group of volunteers aged 50 and over offering computer classes specially designed for seniors. This program, offered by the Palatine Township Senior Citizens Council, is affiliated with SeniorNet, a national nonprofit organization. Each student has their own computer. Each class is taught by a trained instructor, and coaches in each class provide individual attention and support. Course materials are prepared with seniors in mind, including clear step-by-step instructions, repetitive reinforcement and a slow, even pace. This makes the 50 Plus learning experience ideally suited to seniors learning to use the computer.

Registration

- You may register for the fall session in one of two ways
 - **MAIL-IN:** If you have taken classes with us before, complete the registration form on the preceding page and mail it to the Palatine Township Senior Citizens Council no later than Fri., Aug. 28, along with your check for the total amount of the fees and your SeniorNet Application and fees, if applicable
 - **IN PERSON:** Bring your registration booklet with you to in-person registration at the Palatine Senior Center on **Thursday, Sep 10 between 10am and 1pm. (LAST DAY)**
- To complete the registration form, please:
 - Fill out your name and address at the top of the form
 - Circle the course fees and materials charges for any class or workshop for which you wish to register, and write the total for that class or workshop in the Total Column
 - If you have a current membership at the Palatine Township Senior Center, and take one 8-week class, you receive a \$10 discount; write that amount on the line provided
 - Add the total amount for each class and workshop, and write the Total of All Classes and Workshops in the space provided
 - The check for classes and workshops should be made payable to PTSCC (Palatine Township Senior Citizens Council)

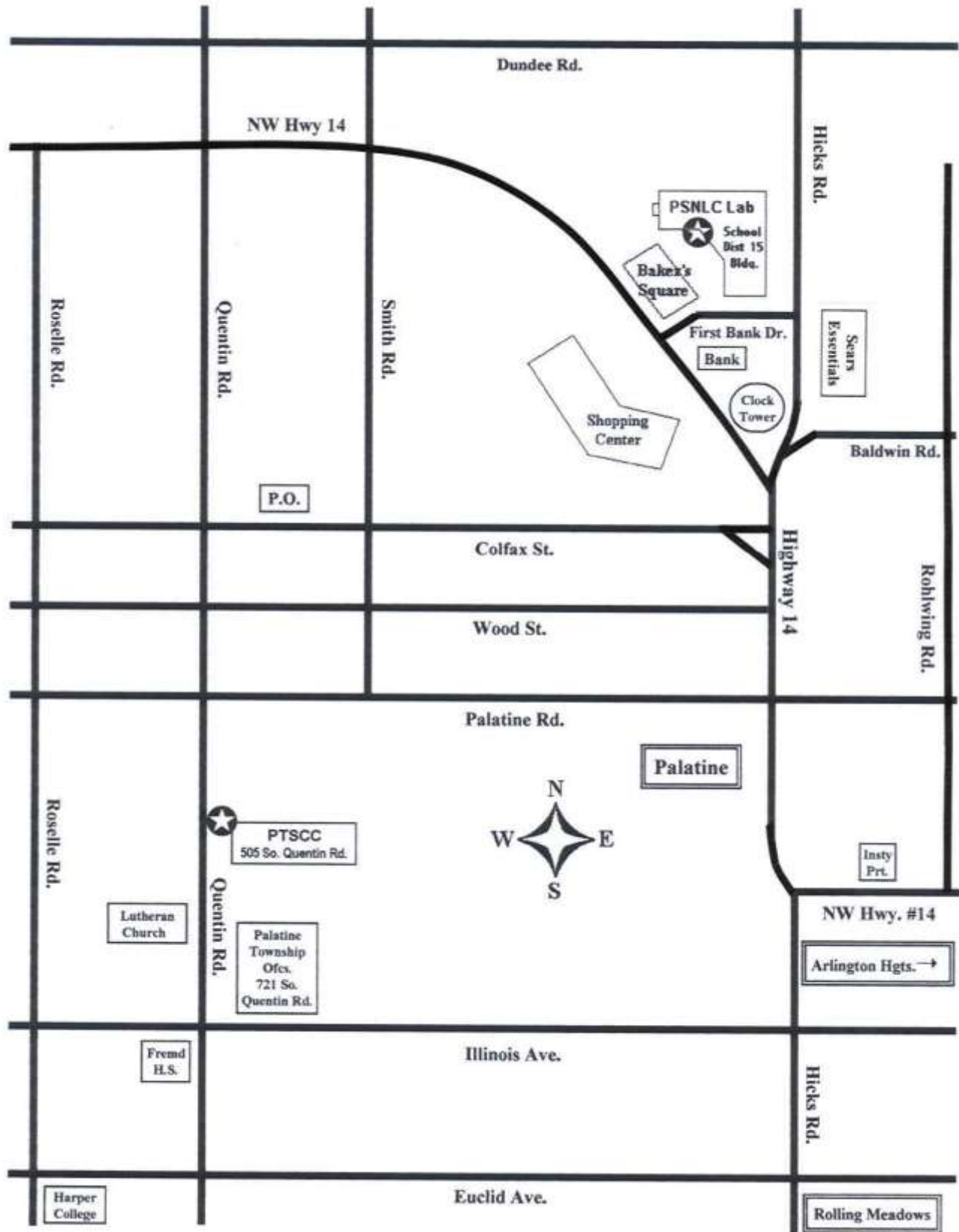
